"The range of challenges facing young people in today's environment."

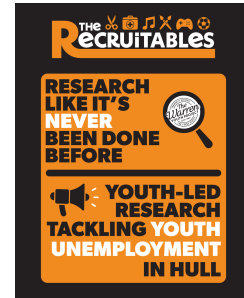

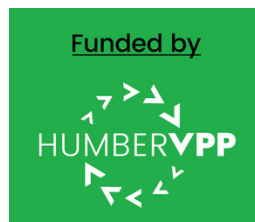

HLC JOIN FORCES WITH THE HUMBER VIOLENCE PREVENTION PARTNERSHIP, TO HELP IDENTIFY YOUNG PEOPLE'S PERCEPTIONS OF VIOLENT CRIME...

HLC is currently working in conjunction with the Humber Violence Prevention Partnership (HVPP) <https://humbervpp.org/> to deliver a series of focus groups with young people across the Humber sub-region.

These sessions aim to identify young people's perspectives about violent crime in their localities, asking questions such as:

- How safe do young people feel and the reasons why.
- How young people feel about their local area and community, including the support, activities, and facilities available to them.
- How young people feel about their future, their hopes, fears, and what change they want to see.



The HVPP exists to lead and co-ordinate the local response to preventing and reducing serious violence, through a public health approach with local partners. This includes the Police and Crime Commissioner, Humberside Police, Humber Council authorities, Youth Justice Teams, the local NHS Integrated Care Board, the OHID, and the Probation Service. Building on recent research by the Youth Endowment Fund that has provided a national picture, HLC are now working with the HVPP to build a more nuanced understanding of what it's like for young people to be living in different parts of our area, recognising that not every place or young person is the same.

THIS-ABILITY SUCCESS STORY: PARTICIPANT JAMES CELEBRATES SIX MONTHS IN EMPLOYMENT....

This-Ability have worked closely with one of Beverley's popular sports bars, Firepit, to provide in-work support for one of its participants they supported into work.

Learner James, who lives in Beverley, applied for a role in autumn last year and was successful at interview and was subsequently taken on as a part-time bar staff member.

With MOBY support and help from the Firepit staff, they are delighted to say James has now completed six-months with Firepit.

He was initially very anxious and nervous around customers and using the till. After consultation with James and Bar Manager Nick, they agreed for James to take his development on a week-by-week basis, putting together a plan to increase his confidence and for him to get used to his surroundings. To begin with, James was tasked to clean the tables, ensure the bar area was presentable and to pull pints whilst another colleague used the till.

After a few weeks, the MOBY support was reduced and James was able to complete his tasks without support but under the guidance of the Firepit staff. To this day, James is a valuable member of the Firepit team and is keen to challenge himself again with more hours.

DRIVING UP SKILLS IN THE WAREHOUSING, SECURITY, HAULAGE AND CARAVAN SECTORS...

In March, HLC launched a new range of free, industry-specific qualifications for 16-29-year-olds in Hull, following the receipt of additional growth funding for the European Social Funded (ESF) Springboard programme.

The HLC driver pathways and licenses were specially designed to help young people who are trying to access roles in the haulage industry, warehousing, caravan, security and construction sectors, but who are restricted due to the lack of necessary industry certificates.

By offering these new training opportunities young people can now get help with a range of qualifications, to further breakdown barriers into work.

To deliver the qualifications HLC have been successfully working in partnership with the Hull City Council's key workers, local specialist training providers, Job Centre Plus and assessment centres.

Paul Howard, Contract Coordinator at HLC who is leading on this new provision, works on a 1-2-1 basis with each participant, together with partners and the key worker team, to coordinate a supportive and bespoke training package to meet their individual needs and ensures any training is facilitated where the young person lives. In addition to the dedicated LGV/HGV driving qualifications on offer, other industry licence areas proving popular, include Fork Lift Truck, door/event security and CSCS.
