GOOD TO GO CELEBRATE PARTNERSHIP WITH HULL FC, RESULTING IN LEARNERS ACHIEVING VOLUNTEERING QUALIFICATIONS DOWN AT THE ALLOTMENT!

Good to Go (G2G) have teamed up with Hull FC to enrol their learners on the Adult Education Budget programme (now Adult Skills Fund), with the aim of achieving a Level 1 Volunteering Qualification.

Hull FC mentor Charlie is now embedded into the G2G delivery and hosts sessions at their allotment every Monday.

To achieve the qualification the learners volunteered over a 6 - 10-week period at various allotments on the Newland Avenue site, helping people, especially the elderly, maintain their plots by weeding, sowing seeds and harvesting their crops. In return the learners were rewarded for their hard work through chocolate biscuits, lovely tea breaks and a share of the crops they had harvested, whilst also gaining valuable horticultural knowledge and achieving their award.

The learners were presented with their certificates on the MKM Stadium pitch and to make the day extra special, they received a special tour of the stadium and got the chance to explore the players' changing rooms.

MULTIPLY PARTNER SHORES IN WITHERNSEA USES LEARNING BUS AND MOBILE PANTRY TO ATTRACT MORE ADULTS ONTO FREE MATHS COURSES...

Through its Multiply East Riding programme HLC is working in partnership with Shores in Withernsea and the East Riding of Yorkshire Council to deliver free adult maths courses out in the community, by effectively using the council's learning bus.

Shores have teamed up with the local authority to use the learning bus to help reach more adults and have made it even more attractive by setting up a free pop up food pantry on board. (Continues next page...)

Learners are able to receive a £15 food voucher when they visit the pantry on the bus but to claim this they must sign up to the Multiply programme to gain basic maths skills.

As part of their learning they will practice and improve their maths skills by having to add up all their shopping to the value of the voucher. This not only helps build confidence in maths but also reinforces the importance of these skills in everyday activities.

This incentive is proving really popular in attracting new learners. Therefore, Shores has now booked to continue to use the learning bus over the next six weeks.

SPOTLIGHT ON: UK SHARED PROSPERITY FUND (UKSPF) FAMILIES LEARNING TOGETHER PROGRAMME...

The new UKSPF Families Learning Together (FLT) programme is being delivered by three partner organisations, Tigers Sport and Education Trust, Hull FC Community Foundation and Hull KR Foundation. This is the very first time that all three trusts in Hull have worked together on such a programme.

Each of the trusts are developing strong relationships with schools in their local areas to encourage parents, through their children, to engage on the programme.

The aim of FLT is to empower parents to develop new skills, achieve greater wellbeing and engage in positive activities that give them a better chance of securing employment. It has three strands - Learning with Children, Learning with Peers, and Learning in the Community. All of the trusts have put together twelve themes which they will cover through their provision, these include life and career skills, mental health, wellbeing, digital literacy and personal development. Part of the sessions will bring parents and children together for fun learning activities that promote family cohesion. (Continued on next page...)
